# Fiscal Sponsorship Spotlight: A New Kind of Library for Medical Equipment

Fiscally sponsored by FJC, Wheel It Forward is a volunteer-run nonprofit that operates a lending "library" that coordinates the lending and borrowing of donated durable medical equipment (DME) in Fairfield County, Connecticut. The organization closes the gap between the cost and durability of DME relative to the often brief, urgent needs for them. Wheel It Forward has worked with a team of almost 100 volunteers to save library members thousands of dollars and to prevent over 34,000 pounds of equipment from ending up in landfills.
